INTRODUCTION

Isaiah Zagar, the creator of Philadelphia's Magic Gardens, often pays direct tribute to artists he admires most, sometimes by mimicking techniques or including their names in his work. Clarence Schmidt, Simon Rodia, Gabriel Joaquim dos Santos, Danielle Jacqui, or Nek Chand Saini are among the many names you will find at PMG. These artists created Art Environments.

Art Environments are permanent, large-scale artworks that encompass an entire space and surround the viewer. Their creators often have no formal art training and use unusual materials to elaborately embellish their environments. Their work represents their extreme individualism and is influenced by personal experiences or mythologies. The artists' devotion to their creations is often all-consuming and spans years or decades.

Philadelphia's Magic Gardens is such a place. It covers five city lots which Isaiah transformed exquisitely over the course of three decades. The space also serves as a tribute to other Art Environments and their creators. Every name is an invitation to another amazing world.

VIDEOS

- <u>Bricoleur</u> is an hour-long documentary about US Art Environments, by Dutch filmmaker Hanna Volbeda. It opens with an interview with Isaiah Zagar.
- <u>Journeys into the Outside with Jarvis Cocker</u>, <u>Episodes 1</u>, <u>2</u>, and <u>3</u> aired on BBC 4 in 1999. It is hosted by former frontman of the Britpop group Pulp as he travels around the world to visit Art Environments and their creators.

 visionary artists in 1995 by following the road trips of the hosts. The 25-minute show ran for 12
 seasons and is titled by state and region. Much of what they captured no longer exists. PMG appears
